

## Sabbath, New Moon, & Feast Days

A Biblical "day" begins and ends at sunset, rather than at midnight.

In Genesis 1:5 [KJV], the story of creation, it says,

"And the evening and the morning were the first day."

From this, we conclude that a day begins with evening, that is, sunset.

Sabbath, New Moon, & Feast Days

Begin the evening before the date specified and

end at nightfall of the date specified,

that is, at the time when it becomes dark outside, about an hour after sunset.

Leviticus 23:32b [KJV]

"...from even unto even, shall ye celebrate your sabbath."

*Light the New Moon Candle

# Levitical Feast Days

Feast Days begin the evening *before* the date specified.

Leviticus 23:32b [KJV]

“...from even unto even, shall ye celebrate your sabbath.”

## Pesach

15<sup>th</sup> - 21<sup>st</sup> of Nisan, 5779

**April 20<sup>th</sup> – 26<sup>th</sup>, 2019**

*The 1<sup>st</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> days of Pesach are Sabbath Days Lev. 23:5-8 [KJV]*

- 5 *In the fourteenth day of the first month at even is the LORD's passover.*
- 6 *And on the fifteenth day of the same month is the feast of unleavened bread unto the LORD: seven days ye must eat unleavened bread.*
- 7 *In the first day ye shall have an holy convocation: ye shall do no servile work therein.*
- 8 *But ye shall offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD seven days: in the seventh day is an holy convocation: ye shall do no servile work therein.*

## Shavu'ot

6<sup>th</sup> of Sivan, 5779

**June -<sup>th</sup>, 201-**

*50 days counting from the 2<sup>nd</sup> Day of Pesach Lev 23:16 [KJV]*

*Shavuot is a Sabbath Day Lev 23:21 [KJV]*

- 16 *Even unto the morrow after the seventh sabbath shall ye number fifty days; and ye shall offer a new meat offering unto the LORD.*
- 21 *And ye shall proclaim on the selfsame day, that it may be an holy convocation unto you: ye shall do no servile work therein: it shall be a statute for ever in all your dwellings throughout your generations.*

## Rosh Hashanah

1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> of Tishrei, 5780

**September 30<sup>th</sup> & October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019**

*The 1<sup>st</sup> of Tishrei is a Sabbath Day Lev. 23:24 [KJV]*

24 *Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, In the seventh month, in the first day of the month, shall ye have a sabbath, a memorial of blowing of trumpets, an holy convocation.*

## Yom Kippur

*The 10<sup>th</sup> of Tishrei is a Sabbath Day Lev. 23:27 [KJV]*

27 Also on the tenth day of this seventh month there shall be a day of atonement: it shall be an holy convocation unto you; and ye shall afflict your souls, and offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD.

## Sukkot

15<sup>th</sup> - 21<sup>st</sup> of Tishrei, 5780

**October 1<sup>th</sup> – 2<sup>nd</sup>, 201-**

*The 15<sup>th</sup> of Tishrei is a Sabbath Day Lev 23:34,35 [KJV]*

*Dwell in booths seven days. Lev. 23:42 [KJV]*

*34 Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, The fifteenth day of this seventh month shall be the feast of tabernacles for seven days unto the LORD.*

*35 On the first day shall be an holy convocation: ye shall do no servile work therein.*

*42 Ye shall dwell in booths seven days; all that are Israelites born shall dwell in booths:*

*39 Also in the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when ye have gathered in the fruit of the land, ye shall keep a feast unto the LORD seven days: on the first day shall be a sabbath, and on the eighth day shall be a sabbath.*
